OTSUMA declaration

The UN world conference of Disaster Risk Reduction,

Approving the contributions made by the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR),

Deplored by the existence of nations that cannot take meaningful actions for disaster prevention and recovery due to insufficient funding, technology, and staff,

Concerned by the fact that refugees arising from natural disasters have no place to go,

Concerned by the fact that refugees arising from natural disaster not coming back to their countries of origins has a negative effect on the countries' reconstruction,

Emphasizing the need to educate citizens on disaster prevention,

Recognizing that sharing information between nations is crucial for nations to provide the necessary aid and enables citizens to take measures against disasters,

Approving the positive effects the Disaster Resilience Scorecard has on disaster prevention,

Recognizing the need for countries to cooperate with surrounding nations for the purpose of preventing disasters,

Emphasizing the fact that the situation regarding natural disasters changes regularly,

Recognizing that hazard maps hold a crucial role in disaster prevention,

Concerned by the fact that there are still many obstacles that prevent people from using evacuation areas, such as how people in evacuation areas are deprived of their privacy,

Emphasizing that cooperation within regional communities is crucial for decreasing those affected by disasters,

Concerned by the fact that many impoverished people are unable to evacuate due to economic restrictions,

Emphasizing the positive effect evacuation practices have,

Emphasizing the need to respect different religions' values,

Concerned by the fact that many societally weak people are unable to have access to economic activity,

Emphasizing the importance of respecting societally weak people's opinions,

Deploring the situation that there are no funds which promote disaster prevention,

Recognizing the importance of protecting cultural properties,

Emphasizing the need for recipients of financial and technological aid to maintain transparency as to how the aid is being used,

- 1. *Requests* Member States with the ability to provide the following aid to countries in need through the UNDRR:
 - a. Aid for planting Mangrove trees,
 - b. Long-term provision of emergency foods, water, and blankets,
 - c. Technological and financial aid for the establishment of shelters:
 - i. Providing sanitary items,
 - ii. Providing lighting technologies,
 - iii. Providing toilets;
 - d. Deployment of technicians and professionals for the purpose of educating local citizens,
 - e. Aid to install sufficient water supply and drainage systems,
 - f. Medical aid, namely provision of medicine,
 - g. Financial and technical aid to install infrastructure to receive and process information both domestically and internationally, namely for receiving meteorological information,
 - h. Aid to install sufficient infrastructure at ports,
 - i. Support for the development of multi hazard early warning systems, and information infrastructure including radio systems,
 - j. Technical support for building structure using antiseismic technology,
 - k. Providing know-how on evacuation drills;
- 2. *Requests* Member States to implement the following in terms of refugees arising from natural disasters with each Member State's situation in mind:
 - a. Acceptance of refugees arising from surrounding countries,
 - b. Maintenance and establishment of routes for refugees to evacuate, while emphasizing that refugees are not limited to them;
- 3. *Requests* Member States accepting refugees to facilitate refugees arising from natural disasters going back to their countries of origin;

- 4. *Requests* Member States to do the following in terms of education, including folklore:
 - a. Introduction of disaster prevention into curriculums for all children,
 - b. Establishment of educational facilities that can also serve as evacuation spots,
 - c. Raising awareness of organizations on disaster reduction,
 - d. Establishing a support system for international training and awareness-raising activities;
- 5. *Requests* Member States to introduce the following for the purpose of providing citizens, including women and less privileged people, with necessary access to information:
 - a. Early warning system for disasters,
 - b. Sufficient disaster risk information;
- 6. *Requests* Member States the following for the purpose of introducing an insurance system for disasters:
 - a. Deployment of professionals to countries in need,
 - b. Cooperation between various institutions within the country;
- 7. Requests Member States to gradually introduce the Disaster Resilience Score Card;
- 8. Requests Member States to strengthen cooperation between countries of the same region;
- 9. *Requests* Member States to conduct zoning operations on the following to regularly review hazards and necessary actions:
 - a. Economic activity,
 - b. Agricultural production,
 - c. Populated areas;
- 10. *Requests* Member States to encourage everyone, including societally vulnerable people, to utilize shelters by making the shelters more sanitary and accessible take actions to maintain privacy within evacuation areas;
- 11. Requests Member States to take actions to invigorate regional cooperation at the time of disasters;
- 12. *Requests* Member States to do the following in order to protect the rights of impoverished people:
 - a. Maintenance of routes for impoverished people to evacuate,
 - b. Maintenance of minimal clothing, food, and housing for impoverished people in evacuation areas;
- 13. Requests Member States to conduct evacuation practices in every regional community;
- 14. Requests Members States to respect female opinions by condemning actions that violate their sovereignty;
- 15. *Requests* Member States to take actions to help societally weak people and woman to gain access to economic activity and disaster information;

- 16. Requests Member States to respect societally weak people's opinions in the process of decision-making;
- 17. Urges all Member States to create a new fund which is the following:
 - a. The fund is established as support to strengthen disaster prevention, not as support after the disaster occurrence,
 - b. Protecting cultural property,
 - c. Making a concrete index based on the disaster situation's report of 2~5 year and GDP, and distribute an appropriate amount of support funds based on the index submitted by each country;
- 18. Urges developing Member States to take South-South cooperation;
- 19. Urges all Member States to promote international humanitarian aids;
- 20. Requests Member States to regularly submit reports to the UNDRR under the following details:
 - a. The submission of a report every 2 years covering each member states' situations, the ratio of those affected, and education in order to determine how much aid each country would provide and receive aid,
 - b. The mandatory submission of a report every 5 years covering how aid is being used in countries receiving them,
 - c. Sub clause a and b to be conducted with the help of the third party-committee established under the UNDRR at the discretion of each member state;
- 21. Urges each Member State establish system to rapidly request aid in emergency situations;
- 22. *Urges* each Member State to submit a report post-disaster on the effect and use of emergency funds of the disaster under the following circumstances:
 - a. Mandatory submission if the member state facing the disaster received aid after the country received aid,
 - b. Submission of the report is at the country's discretion of the member state did not receive any international aid, but is deeply encouraged.
